Hennepin-Dunwoody Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvement Project



Project Background

The City of Minneapolis is planning to make improvements to the existing bicycle and pedestrian facilities along Hennepin Avenue and Dunwoody Boulevard between N 12th St and Linden Ave. The project intends to improve the safety, comfort, and travel experience for all people using Hennepin Avenue and Dunwoody Boulevard and provide an improved biking and walking connection to planned transit routes including the Green Line Light Rail Extension and E-Line Bus Rapid Transit. Planning and design will start in 2022 and continue into 2024. Construction is planned for 2024 or 2025.

Project Goals

- Improve and replace the existing Cedar Lake Trail Bicycle detour along Dunwoody Boulevard and Hennepin Avenue, improving the safety and comfort of the facility
- Make pedestrian safety improvements throughout the corridor, including shorter crossing distances, signal improvements, and new ADA-compliant pedestrian ramps
- Provide a direct bicycle and pedestrian connection to the planned Basset Creek Valley Green Line LRT station and planned E-Line BRT stations
- Improve biking, walking, and transit connections between the Near North neighborhoods and downtown Minneapolis
- Incorporate Green Stormwater Infrastructure and Sustainable Landscaping
