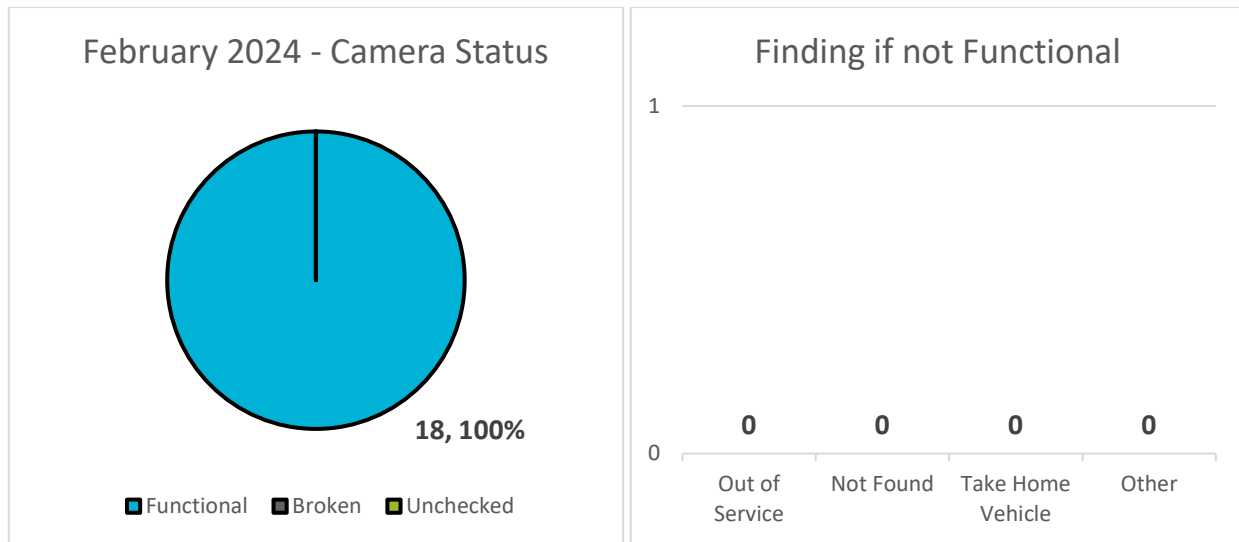


“Within 120 calendar days of the Effective Date, the City will identify and repair or replace any non-functioning or malfunctioning in-car cameras. Thereafter, MPD will require that when officers are assigned to MPD vehicles that are equipped with in-car cameras, the officers will check that the cameras are fully functional at the beginning of each shift and make appropriate notifications when they are not, and the City will repair or replace any non-functioning or malfunctioning in-car cameras within 30 calendar days of an officer’s report.”

During the February 2024 Audit, a sample of 18 vehicles and their cameras were physically inspected which entailed 3 vehicles per precinct and the specialty units collectively. This audit took place on the week of February 12th, 2024. We found all 18 devices could successfully power on and were operational.



The ticketing system for tracking deficient device submissions is in development and will tentatively roll out this spring. In this past period, there was 1 vehicle with a Mobile Video Recorder that required repairs. Of note, the vehicle that was inaccessible for repairs during January’s audit is reportedly still out of service as of the week of this audit.
