

10TH AVE S BRIDGE OVER MIDTOWN GREENWAY

Improving the condition of the bridge and providing safe connections for all



Project background

Constructed in 1915, the 10th Ave S bridge over the Midtown Greenway is planned to be improved over the next few years. The bridge has been closed to motor vehicles since December 2021, due to structural concerns. It remains open for pedestrians and bicyclists.

The bridge is located within two historical sites: the Railroad Grade Separation Historic District and the Midtown Exchange (former Sears Building). The bridge is recognized as an important connection for the community as it supports access over and to the Midtown Greenway, the Allina Health Campus, and businesses on Lake St. The project will engage with many stakeholders, including the Midtown Exchange, Lake Street Council, Midtown Greenway Coalition, and Allina Health.

Planning	Design	Construction	Completion

Spring – Summer 2023: Public Works will collect data.

Summer – Fall 2023: Public Works will initiate communications and engagement with the public.

Fall – Winter 2023: Public Works will develop a concept cross section of the bridge deck.

Early 2024: Public Works to provide a recommended concept of the bridge deck for the 10th Ave over the Midtown Greenway.

Late 2025 – Late 2026: Implementation of improvements to the 10th Ave bridge.


