


*“Within 120 calendar days of the Effective Date, the City will identify and repair or replace any non-functioning or malfunctioning in-car cameras. Thereafter, MPD will require that when officers are assigned to MPD vehicles that are equipped with in-car cameras, the officers will check that the cameras are fully functional at the beginning of each shift and make appropriate notifications when they are not, and the City will repair or replace any non-functioning or malfunctioning in-car cameras within 30 calendar days of an officer’s report.”*

During the March 2024 Audit, a sample of 18 vehicles were randomly selected and their cameras were physically inspected. This entailed 3 vehicles per precinct and the specialty units collectively. There were 17 vehicles tracked down that successfully powered on their main cameras upon starting. One 5<sup>th</sup> precinct vehicle was unable to be inspected due to it being delivered to the Ford Autonation dealership for repairs. The audit took place on the week of March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024.



The ticketing system for tracking deficient device submissions has been implemented starting this month. In this past period, there were 3 vehicles with a Mobile Video Recorder that required repairs and was reportedly serviced in under 10 days. Following up on January’s audit, the vehicle that was inaccessible for repairs is now back in service as of this month’s audit
